Goodyear Library provides county kiosk to record documents

Maricopa County Recorder's Office invites public to library open house on March 19 to learn kiosk operations

What: Maricopa County Recorder's Office Open House

Where: Goodyear Branch of Maricopa County Library District

When: Wednesday, March 19 at 10 a.m.

Purpose: For Goodyear and West Valley residents to learn how to operate kiosk that records documents.

No longer do customers of the Maricopa County Recorder's Office have to travel long distances to record their documents or print them out – they simply can go to the newly-opened Goodyear Branch of the Maricopa Library District to get it done.

On behalf of Maricopa County Recorder Helen Purcell, the county would like to extend an invitation to the public and media to attend an open house to learn how to operate the kiosk and its services available at 10 a.m. on Wednesday, March 19 at the Goodyear Library, 14455 West Van Buren Street, Suite 101.

The dedication of the kiosk marks the fourth anniversary the county recorder's office began implementing them into public facilities such as libraries around the county.

The kiosk at the Goodyear library is the sixth one at a branch of a county library in the Valley, and they are being well received as customers also can communicate with a staff person at the recorder's office in Phoenix if they have any questions while using it.

"We are very anxious to have the support of Goodyear in this venture," said Yvonne Reed, spokesperson for the Maricopa County Elections Office, which is helping to oversee the implementation of the kiosks. "We have had a lot of positive feedback. Customers are finding them very useful to be at a closer location when they need to record documents. It provides assistance at all times."

On March 23, 2010, the county recorder launched the first recording kiosk in the United States at her offices in Phoenix. Since that date she has placed recording kiosks, in addition to her office, in Waddell, Anthem, Fountain Hills, Surprise, and Queen Creek. In 2013, the county had over 2700 kiosk recordings and for this January and part of February, there were about 350 recordings.
