

What do the numbers tell us?

Judicial Productivity Credits (JPCs)

- Justice of the Peace lines are drawn to equalize the workload to no more than 1200 JPCs:




A.R.S. §§ 22-125 H

“The judicial productivity credits for any justice court precinct shall not exceed twelve hundred credits. If the total judicial productivity credits of a justice court precinct exceed twelve hundred credits, the county board of supervisors shall create sufficient courts, or redraw the justice court precinct boundaries according to section 22-101, in order to reduce the judicial productivity credits for any precinct which exceeds that limit.”


Judicial Productivity Credits (JPCs)

- JPCs are allocated as such:
 - 60 Misdemeanors = 1 JPC
 - 10 Felonies = 1 JPC



- If lines can be configured to maintain the same number of districts, without creating any additional ones, there isn't the need for:
 - Additional court building(s)
 - Additional courtroom(s) & administrative office space(s)
 - Additional staff

Judicial Productivity Credits 1996-2010



Part of the reason some districts saw a decline in numbers is due to the removal of photo enforcement on the highways. This accounted for the higher numbers from October 2008-July 2010.



Reduction in Officers

- Another impacting circumstance is the lower number of officers because of vacant positions not being filled due to budgetary constraints.
- Some areas are reporting **19-29%** lower staffing rates.





- Almost **200** precincts have 1000 or less registered voters in them.



Voting Precincts: PEVL

- That number increases to **791** precincts once you subtract the number of voters in that precinct who are on the Permanent Early Voting List (PEVL)
- The average precinct has **47%** of its voters on PEVL, with **351** precinct **50%** or over on PEVL.


- Some precincts do not have facilities in them so they go to a neighboring precinct which has multiple facilities.

Voting Precincts: Fenced Facilities

- By drawing those facilities into the precincts which lack options the voters continue to go to the same PP and voters who live near that facility now go to one closer to their home.
- So the voters who previously lived in Dysart precinct and who live near the high school where Rancho Mirage was voting, will now be part of Rancho Mirage and have a PP located closer to their home.







- Some areas of the valley have traditionally used the city name and then a numbered precinct within that city as the precinct name:



- This is problematic when voters & boardworkers think that their precinct is 106 (as in Mesa 106) when in fact it is number 598.

Precinct Names that are Numbers

- This can cause problems when the voters are trying to locate their polling place, when paperwork is being completed at the polls, etc.
- The most detrimental impact is in provisional voting. If the voter or boardworker puts that the voter is casting their ballot in precinct 106 when they are really in 598 it could result in the ballot not being processed correctly and ultimately counted.






How are new names chosen?

- Regardless of why a precinct is changing, it is getting consolidated or being changed due to confusing former name, every attempt is made to assign names based on that area:
 - Geographic, geological, historic landmarks
 - School & Park names
 - Neighborhoods, subdivisions,
- For some consolidations, just one name was selected to now cover the new precinct:


This area around Encanto Park is the perfect example of using what is not only one of the precincts names, but also what is in the neighborhood:

Voting Precinct Consolidation & PCs

- Concern was voiced that the consolidation of precincts would impact the number of PCs.
- While true that it would lessen the overall numbers, no party is currently even at a 50% full rate of the numbers as they now stand:



“Precincts Under Construction”

- We have begun some preliminary voting precinct changes which are viewable under the “Precincts Under Construction” layer.

 - School Districts
 - Congressional/Legislative (*although these can change*)
 - Tribal Land
- This ensures that communities of interest are not divided & also that we do not create precinct splits which create more ballot styles.





Public Meetings




