MARCH 2010 JURISDICTIONAL EARLY VOTING CLOSES FRIDAY

March 3, 2010 – Phoenix, AZ: Friday, March 5 at 5:00pm, is the last day to vote early in person at any of the three offices of the Maricopa County Recorder, 111 South 3rd Avenue, Phoenix; 510 South Third Avenue, Phoenix; and 222 East Javelina, Mesa.

Jurisdictions whose offices will be open for their own early balloting are city of Scottsdale, and city of Tempe. Replacement ballots may be secured at town of Buckeye, town of Carefree, city of Litchfield Park, town of Paradise Valley, and town of Queen Creek. Town of Fountain Hills will be a drop-off site only. Early Voting hours are during regular office hours and replacement sites will be open until 7pm on election day. Voters have until **7:00pm** on election day to **return** an early ballot at the three offices of the County Recorder or at any polling place in Maricopa County.

Jurisdictions holding elections on March 9 are: Arlington Elementary School District No.47, town of Buckeye, town of Carefree, Deer Valley Unified School District No.97, Dysart Unified School District No.89, town of Fountain Hills, Glendale Elementary School District No.40, Isaac Elementary School District No.5, Kyrene Elementary School District No.28, Laveen Elementary School District No.59, city of Litchfield Park, Palo Verde Elementary School District No.49, town of Paradise Valley, Phoenix Union High School District No.210, town of Queen Creek, city of Scottsdale, city of Tempe, Tempe Elementary School District No.3, Tolleson Union High School District No.214, and Union Elementary School District No.62. Town of Buckeye, Carefree, Paradise Valley, Queen Creek and city of Litchfield Park are holding all mail ballot elections.

As of today, 136,258 early ballots have been returned out of the 330,610 mailed or voted in person.

3 de Marzo, 2010 – Phoenix, AZ: El Viernes 5 de Marzo a las 5:00pm, es el último día para votar temprano en persona en cualquiera de last tres oficinas del Registrador del Condado Maricopa, 111 South 3rd Avenue, Phoenix; 510 South Third Avenue, Phoenix; and 222 East Javelina, Mesa.

Las jurisdicciones cuyas oficinas estarán abiertas para su propia votación temprana son la ciudad de Scottsdale, y ciudad de Tempe. Las boletas de reemplazo pueden ser aseguradas en el pueblo de Buckeye, pueblo de Carefree, ciudad de Litchfield Park, pueblo de Paradise Valley, y pueblo de Queen Creek. El Pueblo de Fountain Hills será un sitio de entrega unicamente. Las horas para votación temprana son durante horas regulares de oficina y los sitios de reemplazo estarán abiertos hasta las 7pm el día de elección. Los votantes tienen hasta las **7:00pm** el día de elección para **regresar** una boleta temprana en last res oficinas del Registrador del Condado o en cualquier lugar de votación en el Condado Maricopa.

Distrito Escolar Primario Isaac No. 5, Distrito Escolar Primario Kyrene No.28, Distrito Escolar Primario Laveen No.59, ciudad de Litchfield Park, Distrito Escolar Primario Palo Verde No.49, pueblo de Paradise Valley, Distrito Escolar Superior Phoenix Union No.210, pueblo de Queen Creek, ciudad de Scottsdale, ciudad de Tempe, Distrito Escolar Primario Tempe No.3, Distrito Escolar Superior Tolleson No.214, y Distrito Escolar Primario Union No.62. El Pueblo de Buckeye, Carefree, Paradise Valley, Queen Creek y ciudad de Litchfield Park estarán conduciendo elecciones solo por correo.

Hasta hoy, 136,258 boletas tempranas han sido devueltas de las 330,610 enviadas por correo o votadas en persona.
