75 FOOT LIMIT; ELECTIONEERING;

A.R.S. § 16-411.H, A.R.S. § 16-515, A.R.S. § 16-1013, A.R.S. § 16-1014

Electioneering is prohibited within 75 feet of the main outside entrance of a polling place. Campaign material including, but not limited to, t-shirts, buttons, hats, signs, stickers, etc. is expressly prohibited and may not be worn or displayed within the 75 foot limit.

Voters may carry information, including political literature, to assist them in voting but they must be discreet and not display it within the 75 foot limit.

Individuals are allowed to electioneer and engage in political activity outside of the 75 foot limit in public areas and parking lots used by voters unless the polling place was acquired under emergency circumstances.

If a voter comes in wearing a hat, buttons, t-shirt, etc. promoting a political view, candidate, issue or political party, follow these steps:

STEP 1 – ask the voter to remove the hat, button, etc. If the item is a t-shirt, ask them to go to the restroom and turn it inside out, or cover it with a jacket or sweater.

STEP 2 – if the voter does not want to do this, please ask them “are you not willing to do this?”

STEP 3 - if the voter is not willing to comply, fill out a Polling Place Event Report (gold half sheet). Write the voter’s name, Voter ID Number and “16-515” on it.

STEP 4 - allow the voter to vote.

STEP 5 – put the Polling Place Event Report in the front pocket of the white Signature Roster notebook.

We will continue to uphold the statutes and AG opinions on this matter *as we have done in the past (remember 2008).*

With the recent media attention we will be providing reinforcement messages to the boardworkers and troubleshooters.

Mi Familia Vota, County Recorder, West Phoenix H.S. Join Forces to Educate Students about Voting

When: Tuesday, September 28, 12:30 p.m.

Where: West Phoenix High School, 3835 W Thomas Rd, Phoenix, AZ 85019-4434

What: Mock election to educate students about process of voting; encourage them to mobilize parents to vote. GREAT VISUALS.

Phoenix, AZ: On Tuesday, September 28 at 12:30 p.m., a Maricopa County Elections official will visit West Phoenix High School to conduct a mock election in two Government classes. Students will hear a presentation on voting eligibility, registering to vote and how to learn about candidates and propositions, among other topics. Students will then have the opportunity to cast ballots in a mock election using official voting booths and an optical scan unit.

Mi Familia Vota, an organization that promotes Latino civic participation through voting and citizenship, will provide voter registration materials for those students eligible to vote. Students will also get information about how to volunteer as part of Mi Familia Vota's unprecedented effort to turn out the Latino vote this November.

"Arizona has a long history of engaging our youth in the electoral process," said Tammy Patrick, Federal Compliance Officer for the Maricopa County Elections Office. "Voters are more likely to participate as adults when they have these positive voting experiences to lay the foundation of civic engagement."

West Phoenix High School is a public charter school with 650 students, 90% of whom are considered Latino. "In this time of political and economic instability, our youth are determined more than ever to make a change. They understand that they're at a crossroads unprecedented by recent generations," said Rafael Reyes, Assistant Principal of West Phoenix High School. "Civic engagement, in this case a mock election, is one way in which the voices of tomorrow's leaders are resonating today."

"Our goal," said Abigail Duarte of Mi Familia Vota, "is to make sure the Latino community knows that our vote equals our voice. We're pleased to work with Maricopa County and West Phoenix High School to educate the next generation on their rights, their family's rights, and the responsibility to vote."

Students were also given a voter designation card which is proportionate to the voter turnout we saw in the 2010 Primary Election:

NR: Not registered

(20-25% of the eligible population)

RDV: Registered, didn't vote

(in the 2010 Primary 70% of the registered voters didn't vote)

VP: Voted, but at the wrong polling place

(1-1.5% of voters go to the wrong PP each election)

V: Voted & Counted!

(in the 2010 Primary almost 30% of the registered voters voted)

All students voted their ballots



SEPTEMBER 28TH, 2010

The students then all stood up and go the following instructions:


All students with the “**NR**” designation sit down—they didn’t register

All students with “**RDV**” sit down—they registered but didn’t vote in the election

All students which have the “**VP**” card come forward but NOT put their ballot into the machine, instead put it in a provisional envelope--they were registered but they voted in the wrong polling place and their ballot will not count.

Finally, have the remaining “**V**” people standing come forward and cast their ballots.

This exercise demonstrated the scope of citizens who participate either by registering and ultimately voting and how these few end up making our decisions for us at the ballot box.

Greetings! Please see the following advisory regarding voting early in-person, and voting with a mail-ballot for the General Election next **Tuesday, November 2nd**:

MAIL-IN BALLOTS:

There is no official "deadline" for mailing ballots in, but after today, the Center for Civic Participation encourages voters casting mailed ballots to return the ballot in person rather than by mail.

Mailed ballots that are received after the election on Tuesday **will not be counted**. Mail ballots can be dropped off at any early voting location (see below), or on Election Day to any polling location within the county of residence for the voter (ex: Pinal County residents must return the ballot to a polling place in Pinal County, but not necessarily the one for their voting precinct). Voters returning mail ballots to a polling location on Election Day do not need to wait in line, but can proceed directly into the polling center to deliver their ballots.

EARLY VOTING LOCATIONS:

Another option for voters that may not be able to get to the polls on Election Day is to vote early in-person at a designated Early Voting location. These are sites located throughout the county that will prepare a ballot for registered voters and allow you to cast the ballot in the weeks leading up to an election. 

This occurred on October 26th and only impacts the voter registration requirement to provide proof of CITIZENSHIP—not the proof of IDENTITY at the polls on Election Day.


So let's proceed with the review of impact as we normally would:

Proposition 200 & Documentation of Citizenship

- Registrants can verify citizenship status a number of ways:
 - Include AZ drivers license number (post October 1996)
 - Tribal Identification to a federally recognized tribe
 - Naturalization A-number
 - Be authorized by providing either a copy of, or showing the following document to an MCED staff:
 - US Passport
 - Birth Certificate
 - Tribal Identification to a federally recognized tribe
 - Naturalization Certificate

The process is still in place as it is believed that it will be appealed.


Prop 200 Citizenship Documentation January 2010 – October 2010



Prop 200 Citizenship Documentation January 2010 – October 2010





Those without included documentation vs those authorized other than by DL





Prop 200 Citizenship Documentation January 2006 – October 2010











Gila River Indian Community New Addressing System

- We have been working closely with the Land Use Planning & Zoning Department of the Gila River Indian Community to update the addressing in our GIS system with their newly named streets and house assignments.



ABOVE: We were able to confirm the northern buildings are residential and the ones on the circular drive are commercial.

RIGHT: We have correctly labeled our GIS maps with the new street names (Ho Hi, Thadai, Shegoi, Kwi, etc.)

Gila River Indian Community New Addressing System

- It was imperative that this be done so that:
 - 1. New registrations and updates to existing registrations could be entered into our system and place the voter in the correct polling place.
 - 2. Mailings to the voters who receive postal delivery to their homes receive the mailings and it doesn't impact their registration status by having the post office return the mail.
 - 3. The address on the voter's registration in the Signature Rosters at the polling place would match their ID and preclude them from having to cast a provisional ballot.
 - 4. Provisional ballot status could be impacted also if the address is not in the registration system and we are unable to place the voter into a voting precinct.

About 992,000 overseas and military ballots were requested in the 2008 midterm election but only a third of those were counted, according to the U.S. Election Assistance Commission.

WASHINGTON — With less than three weeks to go before the midterm election, a growing number of states are coming under pressure from the Justice Department for missing a new deadline to mail ballots to troops and overseas voters.

Election officials in New York, New Mexico and Nevada have been sued by the federal government in the past week or reached agreements to give military personnel and other Americans living abroad more time to return ballots for this year's election.

At issue is a 2009 law that requires county election officials to send overseas ballots no later than 45 days before Election Day so voters can fill them out and mail them back in time to be counted. Most counties met the Sept. 18 deadline, but an unknown number did not.

Schumer wants time for military ballots

BUFFALO, N.Y. (WIVB) - **RELEASE:** U.S. Senator Charles E. Schumer (D-NY), Chairman of Senate Rules Committee, urged the New York State Board of Elections on Wednesday to extend its deadline for counting absentee ballots mailed in by troops deployed overseas by at least an extra 10 days. Schumer said the extension was necessary since New York City and four upstate counties missed an October 1 deadline for mailing out ballots to these military voters.





Requests and Returns by Date





Early Ballot Requests, Returns, Remaining by Party (Number of Ballots)




Early Ballot Requests by Party (Number of Ballots)


Early Ballot Returns by Party (Number of Ballots)


Early Ballot Remaining by Party (Number of Ballots)







Early Voting Sites Ballots Cast as of 10/26/2010









Polling place change reasons from Primary to Election 2010














