# Primary Primer 2010 Edition

- Primary Elections in Arizona are open to all registered voters.
- We currently have 4 recognized parties at the state level: Dem, Grn, Lbt, Rep.
- If the voter is registered to a recognized party that is the Primary ballot that they are given.
- If the voter is not registered to a recognized party, they may selection either a Dem, Grn, or Rep ballot (Lbt have a closed primary).

# Getting on the ballot

- This election cycle was no different from others with the lobbies' public terminals full of campaign workers and candidates checking petitions.
- Petition signers had to
  - Be registered on the day
  - Be registered in the district
  - Be registered to the correct party
  - Only sign one candidate's petition in a given race

  - Secretary of State: all state offices
  - Maricopa County Elections Dept: county offices
- Signage will be posted at the polls to notify voters.
- Votes cast for those candidates will not be counted nor tallied.


- At the time that Boyd Dunn withdrew from the Maricopa County Attorney race and Dean Martin withdrew from the Governor race the ballots were already printed.







# Call Center Wait Times

- Wait time on Monday was high, just over 7 minutes at the peak, as temporary workers were still in training.
- Tuesday the wait time was down to 1 minute.
- 1250 calls were taken on Tuesday
- By this morning, Wednesday, the wait time is now less than 1 minute.

**You Can Use This Form To:**

**To Register To Vote in Arizona, You Must Qualify Yourself:**

- Be a **UNITED STATES CITIZEN** (see citizenship requirement on back)
- Be a **resident of Arizona** and the county listed on your registration
- Be **18 years of age or more on or before the day of the next regular General Election**

**WARNING: Providing a false registration is a class 6 felony.**

**You Cannot Register To Vote in Arizona If:**

- You have been convicted of a felony and have not yet had your civil rights restored
- You have been adjudicated incompetent

**How To Register To Vote:**

- To be eligible for an election, you must register to vote at least 29 days before the election
- You can mail or hand deliver your completed form to your County Recorder's office
- If by mail, the form must be received by the County Recorder no later than 5 days after the last day to register to vote in that election or be postmarked 29 days or more before an election and received by the County Recorder by 7 p.m. on election day
- Your County Recorder's office will mail you a proof of registration within 4 - 6 weeks
- You can register online at [www.azsos.gov](#)

**Citizens With Disabilities May:**

- Contact the County Recorder/Elections Department for information about early voting, accessible voting, or other accommodations.

**PROOF OF CITIZENSHIP REQUIREMENT**

A complete voter registration form must contain proof of citizenship or the form will be rejected. If you have an Arizona driver license or nonoperating identification license issued after October 1, 1996, this will serve as proof of citizenship. If not, you must enclose proof of citizenship with the form. Please refer to the back of the form for a list of acceptable documents to establish your citizenship.

**PERMANENT EARLY VOTING LIST (PEVIL) - VOTE BY MAIL**

Any voter that is required to be included on the Permanent Early Voting List (PEVIL) in order to automatically receive an early ballot for all elections he or she is eligible to participate. To be on the list, the address where you receive mail must be in the county where you are registered to vote. Military and overseas voters are also eligible to be on the PEVIL using their overseas mailing address. To automatically receive an early ballot, mark "YES" in box 1.

If "YES" is marked in box 1, you will be added to the PEVIL. If "NO" is marked in box 1, your name will not be added to the PEVIL, and will be removed from PEVIL if it was previously included on the list. If neither "YES" or "NO" are marked in box 1, your record will remain unchanged as it relates to being on the PEVIL.







# Why does it say 1143 Precincts?


- When voting precinct lines were last drawn in 2007 we followed the canal as a boundary between 0322 Desert Oasis and 1077 Traditions.
- Since that time the housing development has expanded to west of the canal (which was previously barren desert).
- In the May Special Election Desert Oasis voters informed us that they had to travel too to get to the polling place which was at the top of the precinct (where the majority of voters in the precinct live).
- This will be corrected in re-districting next year but for now we have an administrative split.



Dear Postmaster Potter:

I write to request that the U.S. Postal Service (USPS) revoke its new interpretation which requires that certain voter registration documents and other election materials be mailed at the standard postal rate, rather than the cheaper non-profit rate. I believe this will have a serious impact on local government budgets, could infringe on American citizens' voting rights, and is not in compliance with the National Voter Registration Act of 1993 (NVRA).

For many years, under earlier USPS interpretations, state and local election officials have mailed election materials at the non-profit rate. State and local election officials rely on this non-profit rate to keep their costs down and provide timely information to voters as required by the NVRA. This issue was brought to my attention by local election officials because I serve as Chairman of the U. S. Senate Committee on Rules and Administration, which has jurisdiction over federal elections law including the NVRA.

This apparent change runs contrary to provisions of the NVRA, which require that the USPS make the non-profit rate available for any mailings that state or local election officials certify are required or authorized under the NVRA. Most importantly, under this provision, the certification required belongs solely to the election official. It is not open for further assessment by USPS employees or others.

In addition to the conflict with federal law, this unexpected change heavily burdens local governments. The difference between even one week's mailing at these rates can be hundreds of thousands of dollars. The incident in Arizona that brought this matter to my attention showed that the difference between the non-profit and the standard rate would cost the local government an additional \$120,000 for just one mailing. If local governments are forced to reallocate their funds in order to make up this difference, other services and even jobs at the local level may have to be cut.

This potential interpretation burdens every single voter in the United States. It can hinder local governments from providing full and complete election information to all of their voters. The cost implications could even force election officials to close polling places and reduce the number of poll workers. During the course of our inquiry into this matter, the USPS staff indicated that the attempt to close revenue shortfalls may have motivated this reinterpretation. While the USPS may be facing budgetary problems, those problems must not be solved by threatening the budgets of local governments already severely strained, or by impairing the fundamental voting rights of individual citizens.

I urge you to review this matter and revert to the former interpretation that allowed these election materials to be mailed at the non-profit rate.

This is in response to your June 21 letter on behalf of Ms. Tammy Patrick, Federal Compliance Officer of the Maricopa County Elections in Phoenix, Arizona, concerning the eligibility of nonprofit prices for voter identification cards.

Mailing Standards officials at U.S. Postal headquarters have reviewed the Maricopa County mailpiece that was initially rejected by the Business Mail Entry Unit in Arizona. Based on this review, this specific mailpiece is eligible for Standard Mail Nonprofit prices. This does not necessarily mean that other mailpieces, even those which also transmit voter registration information, would also be eligible for Standard Mail Nonprofit prices.

In January of 2006, the Postal Service issued a Customer Support Ruling (CSR) in this matter. I have attached a copy of this ruling, PS-310, for your information. By statute, voting registration officials are subject to a restriction that does not apply to other authorized nonprofit mailers: specifically, "that the official certifies [that the mailing] is required or authorized by the National Voter Registration Act of 1993." This certification is included within postage statements and compliance with the statutory requirement is met when the voting registration official or the official's agent signs and submits the postage statement. Acceptance personnel should *not* attempt an independent analysis whether the mailpiece is "required or authorized by the National Voter Registration Act." As stated in the CSR, election officials are responsible for certifying that the mailpieces they enter are eligible for Standard Mail Nonprofit prices, including the content restrictions.

Federal law permits qualified nonprofit organizations to mail Standard Mail material at special prices, subject to limitations as outlined in Section 3626 of Subchapter II of Chapter 36 of Title 39, United States Code. Standard Mail prices are lower than First-Class Mail prices. To qualify for Standard Mail prices, a mailpiece must not contain "personal information" about the recipient. All qualified nonprofit mailers must meet these requirements when submitting mail at the nonprofit price.

Page 2

As stated above, the National Voter Registration Act of 1993 extended nonprofit mailing privileges to "State and local voting registration official[s]" and restricted the eligibility of qualified mailings to those which are certified by an election official as being authorized by the Act. However, all non First-Class Mail voter registration mailpieces certified by election officials must still meet the same Standard Mail requirements that all qualified nonprofit mailers must meet; see *Domestic Mail Manual 703.1.6.12*, "The voting registration official may mail, at the Nonprofit Standard Mail prices, only qualifying Standard Mail matter that is required or authorized to be mailed at those prices by the National Voter Registration Act of 1993."

I hope this information is helpful. If I may assist you in other postal matters please let me know.





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Savings Breakdown for Maricopa County, Arizona, in 2008



in Maricopa County, Arizona, August 2009**



# Early Voting

- At the beginning of Early Voting we had **755,704** on the Permanent Early Voting list.
- Of those, **177,739** were not registered to a recognized party many of which had not told us which party's ballot they wanted mailed.



## Early Voting Returns as of August 3rd

- So far, of the **601,043** total early ballot requests received we have gotten back **37,096**.
- Of those, **22,117** have gone through signature verification and are ready for tabulation as soon as the Logic & Accuracy test is completed.

# PEVL & Provisionals

- We continue to have hundreds of voters on the Permanent Early Voting List who don't vote the ballot mailed to them but go to the polls instead.
- To ensure that no one is voting twice they have to vote a provisional ballot so that we can be sure their early ballot was not returned.
- We have pre-cleared a letter to mail to voters who habitually do this.

The letter was just pre-cleared and we will mail after the Primary to these voters




This refers to the correspondence to be sent to persons on the permanent early voting list who have voted provisionally at the polls during the last two elections for Maricopa County, Arizona, submitted to the Attorney General pursuant to Section 5 of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, 42 U.S.C. 1973c. We received your submission on June 21, 2010.

The Attorney General does not interpose any objection to the specified change. However, we note that Section 5 expressly provides that the failure of the Attorney General to object does not bar subsequent litigation to enjoin the enforcement of the change. In addition, as authorized by Section 5, we reserve the right to reexamine this submission if additional information that would otherwise require an objection comes to our attention during the remainder of the sixty-day review period. Procedures for the Administration of Section 5 of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, 28 C.F.R. 51.41 and 51.43.

# UOCAVA & the MOVE Act Implementation

- The MOVE Act requires jurisdictions to send military and overseas voters their voting materials electronically if that is the method requested by the voter.
- Materials must be sent out by the 45<sup>th</sup> day before Election Day.
- Arizona has been doing this for a number of years but we have implemented an automated process for material fulfillment.
- Lets review the new process:


- UOCAVA voters can register &/or request a ballot using the Federal Post Card Application (FPCA) which notifies us that they are entitled to certain protections and privileges (such as electronic reception of voting materials).
- They are then designated as a specific type of UOCAVA voter:
  - MIL: Domestic Military
  - OSM: Overseas Military
  - OSE: Overseas Employee (temporarily overseas)
  - OSC: Overseas Citizen (overseas indefinitely)
- These early voting packets are all out-stacked and brought to Jean, our Early Voting Military & Overseas Lead.




# UOCAVA & the MOVE Act Implementation

- This scanning of the barcode triggers the system to attach the following documents to a standard email:
  - Affidavit that the voter signs
  - PDF of the ballot
  - Voting instructions
- The system checks:
  - Ballot style
  - Email address
  - That a ballot has not already been returned by the voter
- The standard email contains:
  - URL links to additional information
  - Phone numbers and email to contact with questions

Dear Overseas Citizen voter, attached is your affidavit and your "Federal Offices Only" ballot for the upcoming election. The "Federal Offices Only" ballot contains instructions on how to use this ballot. As a citizen who indicated that they are indefinitely abroad, you are only entitled to vote for the Federal Offices indicated on the attached "Federal Offices Only" ballot.

These documents are in Adobe PDF format. If you do not have the PDF Reader installed you can download it for free at the following site: <http://www.adobe.com/products/acrobat/readstep2.html>

You can print out the "Federal Office Only" ballot & affidavit, vote the ballot, **sign** the affidavit and then return to us via mail, fax or e-mail. **Make sure your signed affidavit is also sent with your ballot.** In order for your ballot to count, it must be accompanied with a signed voters affidavit, as attached. The affidavit attachment has a 2nd page within it that is the mail panel page. You do not need to return this page but instead this should be used as reference for our return mailing address. Should you choose to return your ballots via the mail, place ballot and signed affidavit into a separate mail return envelope and use the address information attached. The ballot and affidavit need to be in our possession by Election Day (*this date is indicated on your affidavit*) by 7pm at the latest, in order to be considered valid and **POSTMARKS DO NOT COUNT.**

There is an additional option if mailing. The Overseas Vote Foundation (OVF) site has set up access to special OVF rates for FedEx® service when shipping your ballot back to the election office for the current election. These "Express Your Vote" rates are highly-discounted to absolutely free, depending on the country of operation. You can check the lists of participating countries and create a FedEx® Air Waybill through the "Express Your Vote" system using the following link: <https://www.overseasvotefoundation.org/overseas/ExpressYourVote.htm>

If you opt to fax, then fax your voted ballot(s) and signed affidavit back to 1-602-506-8049 or alternate fax number of 1-602-506-5112 (*please follow-up with a confirmation email to this email address stating that it has been sent so that we can confirm receipt*). We will process it and get it into the mix to be tabulated.

If you have an "electronic upload" password and username issued by the Secretary of State Office, you can use this option to return your ballot and **signed** affidavit. **This option is not available to all voters.** When your scanned ballot and **signed** affidavit have been successfully uploaded to the Secretary of State's Office site, Maricopa County Elections will be notified and we will retrieve your voting materials (*ballot and affidavit*) for tabulation.

The ballot dimensions exceed the standard 8.5x11" paper so it may be necessary to print on oversize paper OR you can opt to print it reduced for marking and faxing and use the computer screen version to read (zoom) from. The ballot is not required to be returned on the original size paper and can be reduced for faxing or cut into parts to accommodate for faxing.

# UOCAVA & the MOVE Act Implementation

- MCED had our UOCAVA ballots ready prior to the 45 day deadline.
- When a UOCAVA voter sends a request MCED is able to generate their ballot and materials within 24 hours.
- The report is then retained with the early voting packets.
- These original ballots will be used to duplicate the PDF versions of the ballots when the voters return their voted ballot.
- Voters can verify in real time on the website if we have received their requests and ballots.

# Early Voting: Alternative Formats

- We sent out 90 Large Print ballots & 10 Braille ballots.
- Just as with standard ballots, there are many voters who have not designated a party ballot.
- We also had one voter go back to standard ballot format after regaining her eyesight after a successful surgery!



# Early Voting Locations

- Our pre-cleared process is to have Early Voting at our 3 offices, at South Mountain Community Center, and ask any City/Town Clerk to host Early Voting if they are on the ballot.
- This election cycle we are asking for preclearance to also instill ASU's Tempe campus as an established, permanent early voting location. We have a signed agreement that they will host the site for all future Primary, General, and Presidential Preference elections.

# Early Voting Locations



To whom it may concern:

With regards to the proposed Permanent Early Polling Location at the Tempe campus of Arizona State University, the Undergraduate Student Government at ASU Tempe guarantees as follows:

1. Payroll for recommended site staff will be paid directly by the Undergraduate Student Government to the site staff or indirectly through the University itself.
2. The facility to be used, which is located in the Palo Verde West building on the Tempe campus, is secured for use for an indefinite period of time as authorized by University leadership and any relevant parties responsible for such allocation.
3. Parking for the polling location is authorized in perpetuity by ASU's Parking and Transit Services for said site during the dates that this site would be used for in-person voting. This includes:
  - a. **The tenth Tuesday before the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November, and the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November.** Notwithstanding any other law, an election must be held on this date for the approval of an obligation or other authorization requiring or authorizing the assessment of secondary property taxes by a county, city, town, school district, community college district or special taxing district, except as provided by title 48. (A.R.S. § 16-204.B.1 C & D)
  - b. A presidential preference election shall be held on **the fourth Tuesday in February of each year** in which the president of the United States is elected to give qualified electors the opportunity to express their preference for the presidential candidate of the political party indicated as their preference by the record of their registration. No other election may appear on the same ballot as the presidential preference election. (A.R.S. § 16-241.A)



# Counter Early Voting Turnout so far...




# Election Day Polling Place Locations



- Electioneering and loitering within 75 feet of the main entrance of the building in which a polling place is located. (A.R.S. 16-515, 16-1017, 16-1018)
- Candidates in the polling place for a purpose other than voting.



# Q. What illegal activities should a political observer look for?

- Unlawfully influencing voter
- Coercion of voters
- Tampering with voting equipment;
- Illegal voting
- Interfering with the election officials
- Unlawful voter assistance or instruction



# Q. What illegal activities should a political observer look for?

- Inconsistent application of the law
- Interfering with the voting process; and
- Disregard of Federal and the State of Arizona election laws.

# Key points to remember:

- All voters must be asked for ID.
- If the voter has ID from the list and the address doesn't match they vote a provisional but DON'T have to come back.
- The ID does NOT have to be a photo ID—2 non-photo IDs suffice.
- Voter must vote in the precinct where they live in order for their vote to count.

# Key points to remember:

- All voters have the right to assistance and can bring in someone of their choice to assist them.
- Voters can drop off their early ballots at ANY polling place in the county—they do not have to sign in or show ID.
- Voters designated as an early voter in the roster must vote a provisional ballot.

- MCED also tests every machine used in the polls on Election Day



# Hand Audit


- As with all federal elections we will conduct the hand audit for this election (and the General)
- The political parties will select by random lot the precincts which will have their ballots hand audited, the races which will be audited, and the EV batches.
- The political parties will also be responsible for providing the staff to conduct the audit.
- If they do not provide sufficient numbers the audit does not occur (to date, this has not happened in Maricopa County).

# Reconciliation Audit

- As with all elections, we will conduct our comprehensive Reconciliation Audit of **EVERY** precinct reviewing:
  - How many voters signed the Signature Roster?
  - How many voters are on the Poll List?
  - How many ballots were cast?
  - How many names are on the Provisional Roster?
  - How many provisional ballots were cast?
  - How many votes were transmitted for tally?
